President's message Recalled to a Life of Normalcy in Subang Jaya

"It was the best of times, it was the worst of times, it was the age of wisdom, it was the age of foolishness, it was the epoch of belief, it was the epoch of incredulity, it was the season of Light, it was the season of Darkness, it was the spring of hope, it was the winter of despair, we had everything before us, we had nothing before us, we were all going direct to Paradise, we were all going direct the other way-in short, the period was so far like the present period, that some of its noisiest authorities insisted on its being received, for good or for evil, in the superlative degree of comparison only. "

This aptly described the situation we are facing in our country whereby the lawmakers and the local authorities have so much undue influence on our way of life and trying to assert control in every sphere of our society. The doctrine of the separation of powers seems so far fetched and many of us have accepted it as a norm and applicable only to the elite few of the powers that be.

Our court declaration dated 19 Dec.07 was unprecedented in our association's history as we took to task and challenge the MPSJ (Subang Jaya Municipal Council) of their own guidelines and enforcements of their self-imposed criteria for the Pest Control panel in their jurisdiction over Subang

The aftermath of the March 2008 Tsunamic General Elections and the transition of power from the old to the new state government in Selangor, the air of liberty and justice was a pleasant surprise for PCAM. We were elated when we received a letter on 8th September, 08 from MPSJ's lawyer Zaid Ibrahim & Co. requesting us to meet without prejudice on 24 Sept. 08 for the purpose of exploring the possibility of settling the Summon: 21-262-2007 Stopest (M) Sdn Bhd & Another Vs MPSJ out of court.

On 20 Sept.08, PCAM called for our 5th. Forum to deliberate on the MPSJ issue again. The last court hearing on 28 Aug. 08 was adjourned by the High Court to Jan 19, 2009 and our case was to be heard thro' written submissions and contentions from both parties.


Our members had recently faced unholy persecution from MPSJ, summons was issued to one of our members, and those in its PCO panel asked to pay an additional RM360 p.a. license fees. However, MPSJ refuted that this particular annual fee was with the unanimous consensus of those in the panel. Furthermore, they adduced PCAM was agreeable and had no objections to their guidelines when they held a dialogue with the 3 PCAM Exco sometime late last year. Our apprehension was if this drags on beyond 2009, the MPSJ policy will be enforced on to all businesses and will definitely wreak havoc to our industry. YB Tan Kok Wai (MP for Cheras) and our lawyer Vijay were at the forum to explain to members their stand and finally the forum concluded with the members urging to maintain our principle of "Laissez Faire" or the principle that the economy works best if private industry and markets have the freedom

During the meeting with MPSJ on 24 Sept.08, it was proposed on the following basis for both parties' concurrence:

- That the requirement for pest control operators to register with MPSJ's panel introduced in Jan.07 is to be revoked and all deposits collected be refunded to the respective members of PCAM.
- 2. We, in PCAM maintained that these rulings were flawed by the previous council of MPSJ since its implementation in May 06. We highlighted to them that with 134 local and district councils in Malaysia, we will be at the mercy of these councils.

The E-Kesihatan Scheme with good intentions or....?

Under this scheme, drivers, attendants and conductors of commercial vehicles must undergo health checks and testing with doctors on the e-kesihatan panel which is to be privatized. Doctors who want to be part of the scheme must possess professional indemnity insurance. The objective of this scheme is to reduce road accidents and mortality.

There is a fee charged on each checking which is RM85 by the privatized company. Whereas the clinics and hospitals levy at less than RM10.

A. Questions and Issues in doubt:

- Road Transport Dept. (RTD) awards contract to an untried company to conduct drug tests on commercial vehicle drivers is questionable?
- 2. Do doctors have the authority to take urine samples?
- 3. Is it taken at the privacy of a toilet or privacy totally disallowed?
 - Urine samples can be swap if privacy of a toilet is allowed.
- Diligent doctors are at risk and mercy of those drivers tested "positive" as the drivers' livelihood is affected
- Asking a drug addict driver to give his urine to test and paying a fees is really making the authorities look unprofessional and unwise.
- 6. Or is it just a formality to look good that the authorities are doing their job and also make money at the same time?
- 7. Does the scheme guarantee that all addict drivers etc. will be taken off the roads?
- 8. Is it not the job of the Polis to nab drug addicts, whether there are commercial drivers or not, rather than the RTD?

- B. Commercial and Transport Industries fraternity hopes that the RTD would review the scheme along these lines:
- To conduct an in-depth study of the scheme especially on the implementation aspect.
- 2. If the rule needs to be enforced, the relevant authority who conducts such test demand a high level of impartiality and it should be a free service as a government's duty for the prevention of crimes.
- Do not involve with a 3rd party, who has vested interest and may retreat to subjective ethics when commercial decisions are made.
- The test should be subjected to all drivers as drug addiction cuts across all segments of the society.
- 5. RTD may consider commercial drivers as dangerous on the road. Is RTD not prejudiced against them who have basic human rights and are tax-payers too?

Just as the MPSJ's noble intention to make Pest Operators register in MPSJ's panel with 20 guidelines and levy a deposit RM3,000 to monitor their performance, the e-kesihatan scheme though with good intentions too, if not properly planned and efficiently implemented, may create another bad public image on the efficiencies of the Road Transport Department. (RTD).

- 3. All Pest Control Operators holding a license under the Pesticides Act 1974: PCO Rules2004 and is a member of PCAM shall be eligible to register under a new established panel of MPSJ.
- **4.** Inclusion into the new Panel of licensed Pest Control Operators shall be automatic subject of a nominal processing fee.
- 5. That no deposits/performance bond or similar condition shall be imposed.
- **6.** That other condition, if any, shall be arrived after the consultation and with agreement of the Pest Control Association of Malaysia.

Chronological of events:

MPSJ Consortium and Panel Ruling

Date	Events with Breaking News
May 06	Imposition of Pest Control Operators (PCO) Consortium of 6 companies Initially, all businesses must engage pest control service from this consortium.
July 06	The Sun exposes MPSJ consortium that a 20 years concession was inked by them.
6 Sept 06	Became a public issue and due to the furore by PCAM & its members, the ruling was rescinded by the Menteri Besar,Selangor
Mar 07	MPSJ, however, came out with some new guidelines and controls. 1. Licensed Pest Control Operators must register with their panel instead of consortium 2. Must deposit RM5000.00 as performance bond initially. 3. MOF license and 20 other conditions imposed.
	PCAM & its members protested against MPSJ for its equivocal practices. 1. Why the MOF license? 2. Why the RM5000.00 deposits? 3. Why 20 other conditions? 4. How to justify workmanship?
	MB Selangor revoked the MOF license & the RM5k reduced to RM3k deposit by MPSJ but the 20 other conditions remained.
Sept 07	Appeal letter sent to YDP MPSJ, but appeal rejected
19 Dec 07	Left with no choice, instituted a court declaration (CD) by Stopest (M) Sdn Bhd & 20 other PCOs as lst. plaintiff and PCAM as 2nd plaintiff.
	Knowing full well that PCAM does not have a locus standi, MPSJ lawyers wrote to strike out PCAM as plaintiff. However, MPSJ did not expect individual PCOs to file the CD against them.
28 Aug 08	Last hearing which was adjourned to 19 Jan.09 for written submissions by both parties and the case should be concluded by Mar 09 according to our lawyers.
8 Sept 08	Received letter from Zaid Ibrahim's MPSJ lawyers to explore an out of court settlement.
20 sept 08	5th MPSJ forum by PCAM to update members that MPSJ, besides imposing the panel registered PCO on business premises of F & B outlets, intends to impose on all other business premises in the coming future.
24 Sept 08	Meeting with MPSJ officials initiated by them to explore out of court settlement.

We are glad that MPSJ now, has a better comprehension of our plights and struggles and the meeting concluded fruitfully with positive developments for reconciliation and healing of our relations with MPSJ which was one of our primary objectives under our very own articles. This episode will definitely go down well in our annals as one unblemished legacy whereby these 20 companies (who filed the class action) can rightfully be accorded YBs, for their fearless and courageous determination to go the distance with MPSJ.




